The qualifications you need to become a police or detective constable for each entry route

Detective and Police Constable Initial Police Learning and Development Programme (IPLDP)

- Hold 2 A levels or a level 3 that is equivalent qualification in any subject or are in your last year of study
- or are a current serving PCSO, who has completed your professional development plan, passed your probationary period at the time of application and are up to date with all mandatory training
- or are a current serving Special Constable who has attained independent patrol status at the time of application, who is consistently completing sixteen hours per month and is up to date with all mandatory training

Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship (PCDA)

- Level 2 qualification, minimum grade C/4 in English & Maths
- Hold 2 A levels or a level 3 that is equivalent qualification in any subject or are in your last year of study
- or are a current serving PCSO, who has completed your professional development plan, passed your probationary period at the time of application and are up to date with all mandatory training
- or are a current serving Special Constable who has attained independent patrol status at the time of application, who is consistently completing sixteen hours per month and is up to date with all mandatory training

Police Constable Degree in Professional Policing (DiPP)

- Degree in Professional Policing, or
- In your final year of study

PCDA - Accepted Level 2 Maths Qualifications

- Functional Skills – Maths (Level 2)
- GCSE Maths Grade 4/C or above including the following: Short Courses/ Piolet Courses, Double Awards (min. acceptable C/D), Linear Maths, Modular Maths, International GCSE - any Maths in the title of the qualification, Use of Mathematics, Application of Math, Additional Maths, Level 1/2 Certificate in Mathematics
- Key Skills Application of Number/ Numeracy (Full Certificate/ All Units) – Minimum level 2
- Basic Skills Certificate - Certificate in Adult Numeracy – Minimum level 2
- A/AS Level Maths including the following: Pure Maths, Further Maths or Use of Maths - Minimum grade E
- O Level Mathematics – Grade C (Pre. 1975/evidence of a Pass)
- Essential Skills Wales Application Number – Minimum level 2
- Essential Skills Northern Ireland Application Number – Minimum level 3
- CSE Mathematics – Minimum level 1
- Core Maths Level 3 (where included in performance tables) to include Mathematical Studies, Using and Applying Mathematics, Quantitative Problem Solving, Mathematics in Context, Mathematics for Work & Life, Quantitative Reasoning – Minimum grade E

PCDA - Accepted Level 2 English Qualifications

- Functional Skills – English – Minimum level 2
- "GCSE English Grade C/4 or above - any with English in the title. Including: -- English Literature- Level 1/2 Certificate in English Literature / Language- International GCSEs - any with English in the title- English Communication- English Studies- English Language- Double Awards (minimum grade acceptable CD)- Short courses, Pilot courses.
- NOT acceptable is English as a Second Language.
- Key Skills Communication/Literacy (Full Certificate/All Units) – Minimum level 2
- Basic Skills Certificate L2 - Certificate in Adult Literacy – Minimum level 2
- "A/AS Level English - any with English in the title. Including:- English Language- English Literature- English Language and Literature“ – Minimum level 2
- O Level English, English Language, English Literature or English Language and Literature - Minimum Grade C or pre 1975 evidence of a PASS
- CSE English – Minimum grade 1
- Pre U Certificate Literature in English – P3
- Essential Communication Skills or Essential Skills Wales in Communication - Minimum level 2
- Northern Ireland Certificate in Essential Skills Communication – Minimum level 2
- British Sign Language - regulated qualifications (ONLY where British Sign Language is the Apprentice’s primary language) – Minimum level 2 or SCQF Level 5
- Scottish Advanced Higher in English (SCQF Level 7), Scottish Higher in English (SCQF Level 6), Scottish National 5 in English (SCQF Level 5), Scottish Intermediate 2 in English (SCQF Level 5), Scottish Standard Grade Credit in English (SCQF Level 5). Minimum Grade C
- Scottish National Certificate Unit Communication (SCQF Level 6), Scottish Core Skill Unit in Communication (SCQF Level 5), Scottish Workplace Core Skill Unit in Communication (SCQF Level 5), Scottish National Unit Literacy (SCQF Level 5). Pass
- Scottish Ordinary Grade in English (SCQF Level 5). Minimum grade C
- IBO Middle Years Programme Level 1/2 Certificate in Language and Literature. Minimum grade 3
- "International Baccalaureate Diploma Standard or Higher Level Qualification in:- English A: Literature or- English Literature and Performance- English A: Language & Literature"
- Overseas qualification are acceptable with clear evidence from NARIC (a certificate/statement of comparability)** that qualification is an equivalent level to the minimum SASE requirements and additional information that confirms qualification is equivalent to GCSE A*- C.
- International Certificate of Christian Education - ICCE (General or Advanced) English
- GCSE English as a Second Language, Access to Higher Education Diplomas, FE Access Programmes in Literacy, GNVQs – **not accepted**
