To maintain our success with the Derbyshire Volunteer Police Cadets, we are on the lookout for PSVs to become cadet leaders to help mentor the young people who take part. Whether it be delivering a teaching programme of any sort, engaging in a community activity, or leading a Duke of Edinburgh expedition, we are looking for leaders to support and encourage these young people.

The Derbyshire Volunteer Police Cadet Scheme is aimed at 13 to 18 year olds who wish to have an insight into the police, and are keen to be involved in a police orientated youth group working alongside their local communities. The aims of the scheme to give young people an insight into the many and varied aspects of policing, to make them aware of the role of the police in society, to develop their character, and to promote good citizenship.

The team is looking for leaders who are passionate about inspiring and helping young people, and who can commit to it on a regular basis. Cadet meetings are 1900-2100hrs every Thursday (academic year) plus some weekend work during the year.

Essential Criteria:

- Written communication skills.
- Experience of professionalism on the telephone.
- Basic IT skills.
- The ability to motivate a team to achieve a set objective and good communication skills with a wide range of people, as individuals or in groups.

Desirable:

 Any experience in areas such as drill, mountaineering or outdoor pursuits is always useful – however not essential.
