Role Purpose: The main purpose of this Volunteer role is to provide support as an Adult Leader for a Unit(s) of Volunteer Police Cadets (VPC).

Some of the tasks we would like your help with:

- Regularly attend VPC evenings, to aid delivery of the Force's VPC programme.
- Assist the organisation and planning of the VPC programme, in support of the Lead Coordinator.
- Actively support Police & Partner Operations, through personal involvement & supervision of deployed Police Cadets.
- Actively support Social Action volunteering in the community, through personal involvement & supervision of deployed Police Cadets.
- Assist the personal development of the young people engaged on the VPC programme, through your commitment to the cause and ability to be a positive role-model.

What skills you need:

- Good communications skills
- Confidence, commitment, flexibility and enthusiasm
- Ability to work as part of a team and with young people especially
- Must be aged 18 or over

What training and support you will receive:

You will take part in an induction to help you understand your role and how the force works, along with training on how to use specialist databases and IT systems.

You will receive bespoke training, guidance and support from the Force VPC Lead Coordinator.

How much time?

VPC evenings last for approximately 3 hours per week, during the academic year; you don't have to commit to volunteering each single week, however a strong commitment to the role is required. You are also expected to volunteer an additional minimum of 3 hours per month in support of Operations and Social Action events.
