

Cadets receive a police cadet uniform and is completely free to join!

Junior Cadets are aged between 10-13 years old and meet for one hour per week, with a choice of attending at either Chesterfield or Derby.

Regular Cadets are aged between 13-18 years old and meet for 2 hours per week, with the choice of attending at either Glossop, Derby or Chesterfield.

The Application Form

The application form will provide us with some personal information about you, including two questions that you are required to complete, which are:

- Why do you want to be a VPC?
- What are you hoping to gain from becoming a Volunteer Police Cadet?

This information will be used in the selection process, please read the questions carefully and provide as much information as possible.

Parent/Guardian Consent

This is to be completed in full and signed by the person having parental/guardian/ward responsibility for the Cadet. Please read the document carefully and mark whether you do or do not consent to each. You will need to upload this document when you apply through our E-Recruitment portal.
